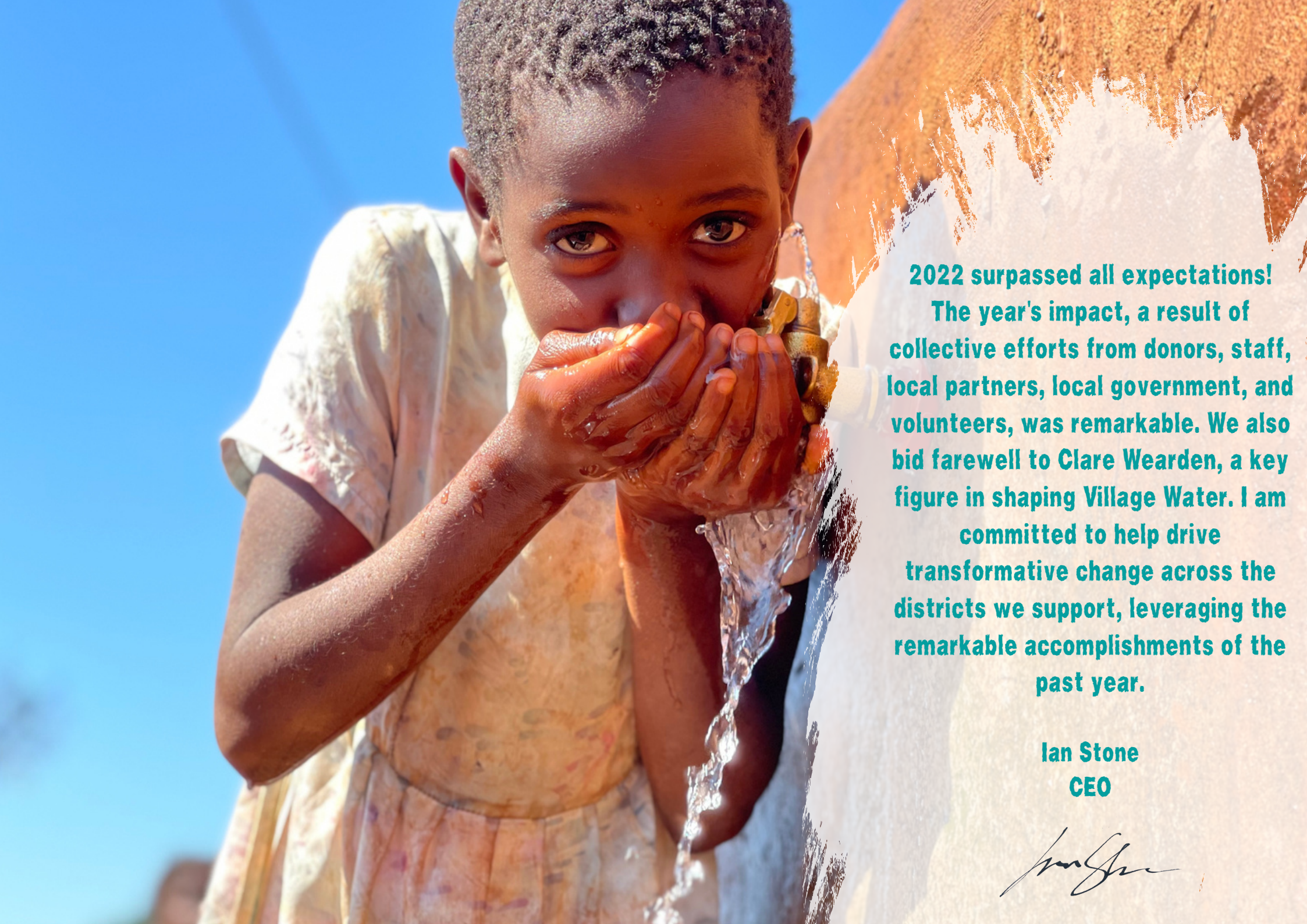

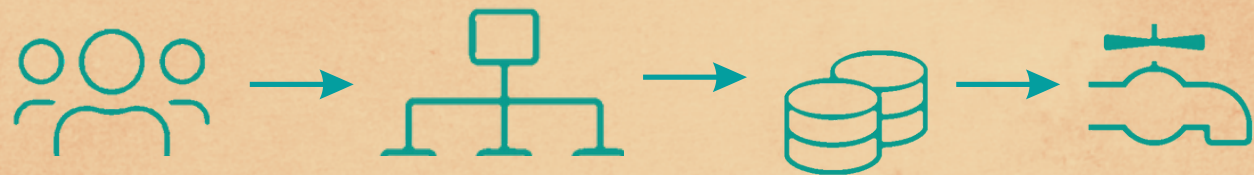




THE DISTRICT WIDE PLAN

Last year we scaled up district-wide plan activities, addressing gaps in safe water provision within districts where we currently work. Our aim is to support lasting infrastructure and systems that ensure communities have continuous access to safe water.

We are currently working on district wide plans in three districts across Zambia & Mozambique.

Safe water in every community

DISTRICT WIDE PLAN ACTIVITIES: 2022–30



ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT

- Training latrine masons & well construction teams in climate resilient sanitation models
- Training Area Pump Minders & supplying them with tool kits so that they can fix pumps within their community and train others to help them
- Supporting spare parts shops to provide affordable spare parts
- Quarterly water quality testing across the district & doing remediation works where necessary



SCHOOLS & HEALTH CENTRES


- Installing climate resilient water systems in schools & health centres
- Menstrual pad production workshops in schools to teach girls how to produce affordable hygiene products
- Installing handwashing facilities & showers
- Ensuring that all schools and health centres have good access to toilets including disability access
- Tracking absences to ensure boys and girls have consistent quality education



VILLAGES

- Rehabilitating broken pumps & installing new water systems in villages
- Mass training in health, sanitation & menstrual hygiene to reach everyone in the district
- Promotion of household sanitation, rainwater harvesting and water treatment options
- Strengthening water committees so that they can manage their own water system
- Putting in place a support network to ensure the water is safe, reliable and high quality

ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT



"I am skilled in pump repair and maintenance and know all the water points in the district where I live. Villagers call me if their waterpoint breaks down and pay me with community funds. There is more work than I can do, so I am training two other pump minders to help me."

VILLAGES

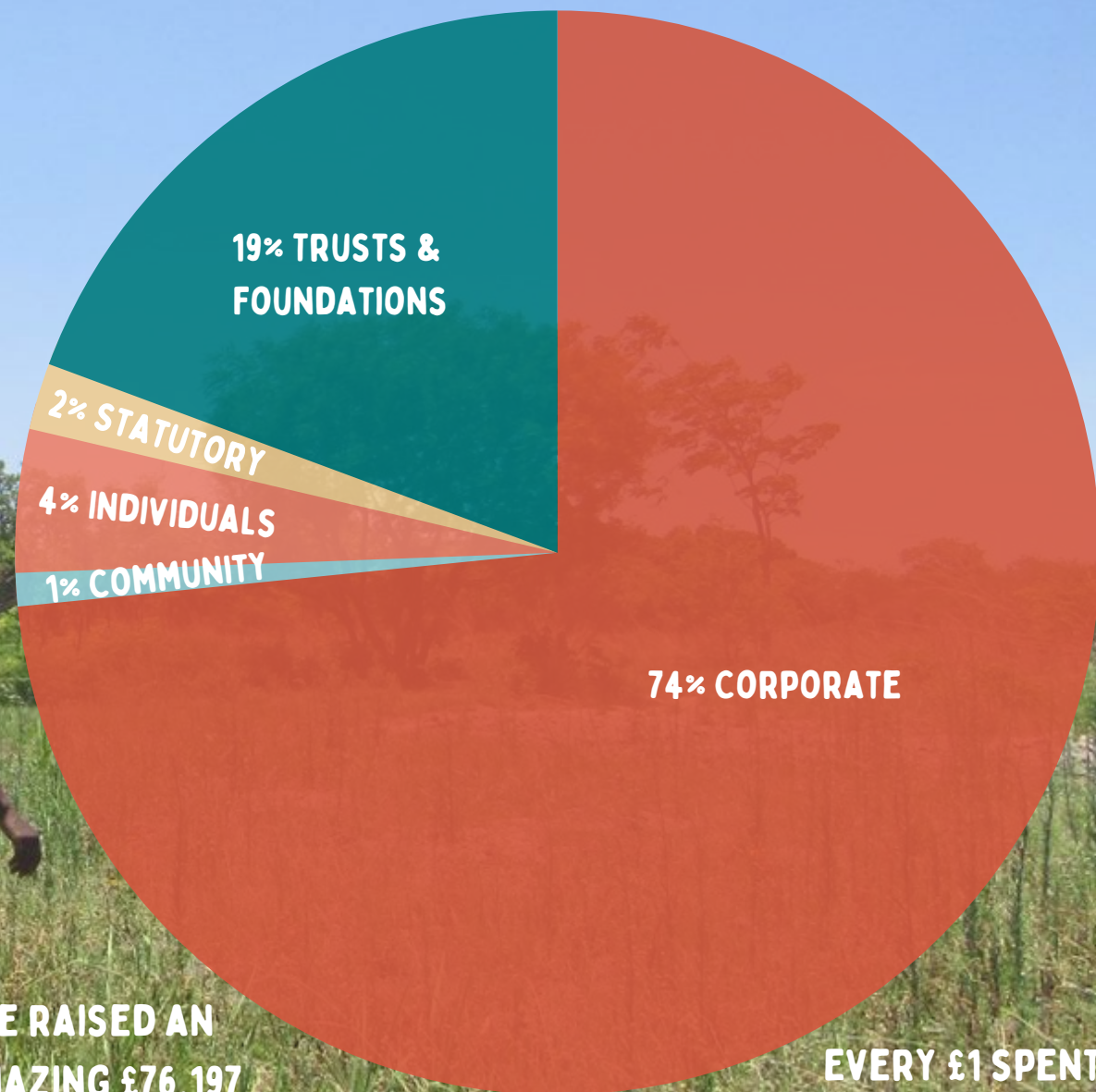


"My name is Emuta Muyanda, I am 91 years old. I am very grateful for this new water point as it will mean that my daughter and grand-daughters will have more opportunities than I have had in my lifetime. Without needing to spend hours every day collecting and boiling water they will have time to farm and earn an income, and the children will be able to stay in school. Everyone in the community will be healthier now as the old water source was contaminated by children defecating nearby."
